

SCRIPTURE

Make no mistake, there is darkness and there is light. Someday there will be only light, but not yet. Isaiah says darkness covers the world, but over Israel God's light is shining. It shines so brightly that the people will themselves become light for the rest of the world. No one is doomed to darkness. Darkness is a choice. All who seek light will find it. When Herod hears of the starlight followed by the Magi, he wants to know of it. He wants it brought to him, not to bask in its brilliance, but to devour it. The foreign kings bring news of the birth of light and Herod resolves to snuff it out.

Even Paul speaks of light that is seen by some and not others. Knowledge is his light, and it was given to him by God, even though it was withheld from former ages and sages. Now it is made known: the rest of the earth, not just those on whom God's light first shone, are heirs of the light. Gentile as well as Jew can bask in the glow of the Gospel. Some are so eager for that light that they come from afar, seeking its source. They find him, lying in his mother's lap, fragile and helpless. But anyone with eyes to see will recognize him, fall upon their knees, open wide their hearts, and pour forth their greatest treasures. And when they do, they, too, will be light.

SHARING FAITH

Why is light such a pervasive symbol in the Bible? How does it speak to you of the presence and work of God in your life?

This solemnity celebrates Christ's manifestation to the world. How do you manifest the presence of Christ in your life?

The Magi followed the light of a star to find the Light of the World. Who or what has lit the way for you, guided you toward Jesus, shown you the love and mercy of God, and helped you to see Christ in all people?

LIVING THE LITURGY

In some countries, gifts are exchanged today instead of on Christmas. Think of someone in need of "light" in their life and give them a gift of a small candle.

The foreign kings needed humility to pay homage to a "king" who was so different from themselves. Find a book or article to read that espouses a position you would have trouble accepting. After reading it, list at least three things you learned and see differently than before.

Together with your family, make a menu for the week, incorporating everyone's favorite foods from other countries. Read a little about each country represented in your menu, learn a word or phrase in the language, listen to the nation's traditional music, and so on. When you say grace, pray for peace and blessings for the people of each land, remembering that Jesus is the Shepherd of all.

REFLECTION

"... the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel" (Ephesians 3:6).
