

SCRIPTURE

Isaiah's words this Sunday are so familiar to us. We hear them during the Advent season when we hear about John the Baptist, herald of the Messiah. We hear echoes of them in our Lenten season as we again hear the Baptist's cry to repent and change our sinful ways. The use of this reading for the feast of the Baptism of the Lord is stirring.

When believers approach the waters of Baptism, either themselves or carried in the arms of their parents, they or their parents for them are invited to repent and denounce sin. They are also asked to profess their faith in God — Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We believe the Holy Spirit will give us what we need to be heralds of the Good News and witnesses to the kingdom of God. This is our faith. This is our call. Strengthened by the Holy Spirit, we, like John the Baptist, announce the coming of our Savior!

SHARING FAITH

Jesus' experience at his baptism was profound. The Father offers us the same intense experience of responding to his call. How do you experience being the Father's beloved son or daughter?

Pray Psalm 104. What does it tell you of our need to depend on God for life?

What impact on you and your parish community does it have to witness someone being baptized?

LIVING THE LITURGY

Discuss what renouncing sin and professing faith means. Think about the questions used when the sacrament of Baptism is celebrated. How do you continue to renounce sin and profess your faith in the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?

Find someone in your church who is planning a Baptism of a new baby or someone who is in your parish catechumenate process and preparing for Baptism at Easter Vigil. Write the family or person a card telling them that you will be praying for them as they prepare for the celebration of Baptism. Place their name in a prominent place, perhaps the kitchen table or refrigerator, so you remember to pray for them.

Make a list of all the places you will go and people you will see this week. Think about and then decide how you can be a herald of Good News to those you meet. What will you proclaim through your actions and words?

REFLECTION

He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire (Luke 3:16)
