#### "OPPORTUNITIES FOR GROWTH AND RENEWAL"

Beloved Pilgrims of Hope,

Greetings of peace, love, joy, and hope!

Jesus' baptism in the Jordan by John signaled His public ministry. He did not confine Himself in His home, but He went about doing the work of the Father. This Second Sunday in Ordinary Time presents to us Jesus performing a miracle in Cana.

## **SCRIPTURE**

The psalm response today sets the course for us as the people of God. We are called to proclaim God's marvelous deeds everywhere and to everyone — in neighborhoods and in workplaces, to nations, and to our families. All the gifts God has given us compel us to sing praise to all the earth and to give him the glory and praise he deserves.

Offering this witness to God's glory requires effort. Paul's instructions to the Corinthians taught them that the Spirit gives each gift so that believers might manifest God's love to each other and to the world. Gifts are given for service. The Spirit gives abundant gifts that are rich in diversity. All the gifts are signs of God at work in the community.

The wedding feast at Cana puts the crowning words of the call of disciples on the lips of Mary, Jesus' mother. "Do whatever he tells you" (John 2:5), she says. These words should echo in our own ears and hearts because, if we follow this command, then God's love will overflow to all the nations. His deeds will be proclaimed to all the nations through our use of the abundant gifts from the Holy Spirit.

## **SHARING FAITH**

If you were to throw a party to celebrate God's faithfulness in your life, what would be the occasion you would choose?

How have you practiced good stewardship of the gifts God has given you?

What barriers to others using their gifts have you, though unintentionally, created or constructed?

## LIVING THE LITURGY

Make a list of the gifts that you see from the people around you (your family, small faith group, classmates, work colleagues). How does at least one person help you see God's power or love? Write a postcard or brief letter to that person affirming what you have seen.

Pick a saint. Choose one randomly or choose your parish or school's patron saint or perhaps the founding saint of a religious community in your area. Read about them. What was the witness of their life? Tell someone else what you discovered.

In the passage about the wedding feast at Cana, the newlyweds don't realize Jesus gave them the gift of wonderful wine. Set aside some time for quiet meditation and journaling. Look back on your own life and think about a gift that it took you a while to discover God had given you. Journal about the impact of this gift on your life.

## REFLECTION

Proclaim his marvelous deeds to all the nations (Psalm 96:3)
