

SCRIPTURE

Today the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, calculated from Christmas Day, following Luke's computation it is 40 days since the birth of Christ. Previously, this day was known as the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Mary's observance of the Jewish legal requirements for purification after childbearing. That perspective is gone, and today the feast celebrates another manifestation of Jesus. The Epiphany marked Jesus's manifestations to Gentile nations, but on this day Jesus is manifest among his own people as the fulfillment of their messianic hopes. So, in effect, today is another sort of Epiphany.

In the coming to faith, one may encounter many stumbling blocks. One of the largest of those obstacles can be the humanity of Jesus, and especially the suffering he endured. Early converts to the faith had to struggle with the notion that Jesus was human like us, a mortal subject to the unavoidable suffering and death of earthly life. It would have made more sense to embrace a god who saves by being impervious to the limitations of the flesh and who would vanquish death not by experiencing it, but being exempt from it. As always, the ways of God are not our ways and the Lord chose the very path that human sense would banish.

SHARING FAITH

What does it mean for you to "And suddenly there will come to the temple" to God as the people did in the First Reading?

Where and how is Good News being proclaimed today?

If you were to read a scroll in front of your parish community saying what you are committed to doing, what would be on it?

LIVING THE LITURGY

In a group, brainstorm the image of the parts of the body in relation to your family, small group, or parish. What is the purpose of each part? For example, perhaps eyes see with clarity or understanding, they help us focus; the calf muscles help us sprint when Christ's work of service needs a quick response; the stomach helps digest the Scripture, etc.

Check with your church or school to see if you can create a bulletin board collage or make one for your home. Draw or take pictures showing examples of how the gifts Paul lists in the Second Reading are used in your church or school.

Make a list of instructions for how you think the members of Christ's body in a parish are to live. Read all four readings for the kinds of things needed in order for them to be true witnesses to God's love and covenant.
