FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

"CHRIST IN US: LOVE AND HOPE FOR A BROKEN WORLD"

Beloved Pilgrims of Hope,

Greetings of peace, love, joy, and hope!

Our Gospel this Sunday draws us once more to the intimate moments of the Last Supper, where Jesus, in His final discourse, imparted a profound truth. Last week, we reflected on His new commandment—to love one another as He has loved us. This week, He continues, teaching that love is not merely an expression of affection but a call to faithfulness, truthfulness, and steadfastly keeping His word. Through such love, we do not stand alone; rather, we are drawn into a deep relationship, not only with Jesus but with the Father Himself.

How profound and personal these words must have been for Jesus as He spoke to His disciples. And how relevant they remain for us today. Love is not merely a sentiment; it is a movement of the soul, a commitment that demands presence, integrity, and devotion. Let us respond wholeheartedly, allowing His light to shine within us so that, through love and hope, we become instruments of His grace.

SCRIPTURE

Perhaps some of us remember one of the times we were left alone by someone who loved us, maybe by a relative or guardian. Or perhaps we have had the experience of a child clinging to us as we are trying to go out the door, pleading with us not to leave them. Either experience may give us a hint of the reassurance Jesus is trying to give his disciples in today's Gospel reading.

Jesus has tried to prepare his disciples. He taught them, gave them examples, prayed for them, corrected them, called them and loved them. He tried to reassure them telling them that his Father would dwell with them and in Jesus' name would send an Advocate, the Holy Spirit, to them. An advocate is somebody in your corner, backing you up. They actively support you and believe in you. They are a champion, a defender, even a guardian. And they never leave you alone.

God dwells in us and the Advocate is coming. The Spirit promised in Jesus' name gives disciples whatever they need to proclaim the Good News and follow the risen Lord.

SHARING FAITH

What does it mean for God to dwell within you? When have you been aware of God's presence in you?

We are preparing for the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. How can you be more fully aware of the presence of the Spirit in your life?

What is one message in today's Scripture readings that helps you continue your faith journey as a disciple of Christ?

LIVING THE LITURGY

As we prepare to celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, we celebrate the diversity of the many members of the one body of Christ. Visit a church other than your own. Participate in their celebration of the liturgy or evening prayer. Discuss with a group or reflect individually on how this is parish similar to your own and how it is different.

Individually or as group, decide on an issue of justice that needs attention. The Campaign for Human Development (sponsored by the United States Council of Catholic Bishops), your parish bulletin, or diocesan newspaper or website will have some ideas. Decide how you can make a difference such as write to your congressional representative, volunteer, collect goods. Be an advocate for something.

Find someone who is alone (for example, someone who is ill or in assisted living). Make a card or visit them. Let them know someone cares for them.

REFLECTION

Jesus said to his disciples: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him" (John 14:23)
