V. Show us, O Lord, your mercy. Rx. And grant us your salvation.*

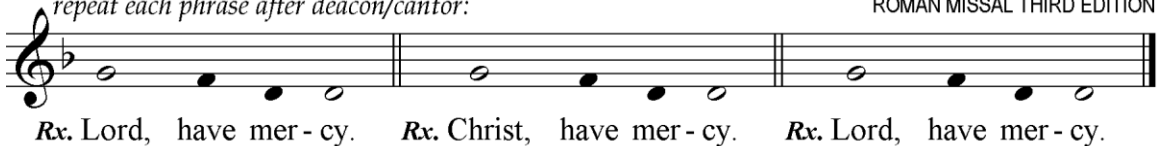
